Health Care Reform Task Force Structure



- **17 Task Force Members:**
 - 4 Legislators
 - 3 Commissioners: Human Services, Health, and Commerce
 - 10 members from the private sector including representatives from health care, long term care, social services, disability, and business

- **Four Work Groups:**
 - Access

 - Care Integration and Payment Reform

 - Health Workforce

 - Prevention and Public Health

Public Participation



- More than 60 public meetings of the Task Force and Work Groups were held between November 2011 and December 2012
 - Over 1,500 people attended
 - More than 115 individuals and organizations provided public comment at meetings
- Over 750 public comment letters – more than half of them from individuals – were submitted to the Task Force
- “Citizen Solutions” met with more than 1,100 Minnesotans
 - April-June 2012
 - More than 40 state-wide community meetings
